## Year 6 Writing

As well as our Year 4 children taking their Multiplication Tables Check, our Year 6 children have been working incredibly hard on their writing. Writing is teacher assessed under the End of Key Stage 2 Tests and Assessments. To ensure consistency in teachers' judgements across the country, local authorities are required to moderate samples of writing across their schools. It was the turn of Telford Junior School to provide samples of children's writing for this moderation process, with Year 6 teachers attending a moderation day, presenting children's work and explaininng the basis for their judgements. I am pleased to say the local authority moderators agreed with our teachers' judgements and were extremely positive about the quality of writing shared. We are very proud of the endeavours of the children and the quality of the writing they are achieving.
